Ensure swift justice

Direct the relevant authorities to expedite investigations and judicial proceedings to bring the perpetrator(s) to justice promptly, reinforcing trust in our legal system.

2. Enhance security measures

Mandate the implementation of comprehensive security protocols across all hospitals, including:

- 24/7 surveillance systems
- Adequate lighting in and around hospital premises
- Deployment of trained security personnel
- Controlled access to sensitive areas such as doctors' quarters and on-call rooms
- Form a dedicated task force comprising representatives from the Ministry of Health, hospital administrations, law enforcement agencies, and medical professional bodies to assess and reinforce the safety of healthcare workers nationwide.
- 3. Take urgent and meaningful legal action against perpetrators of similar crimes against any woman in the society to deter others from engaging in such crimes.
