Ceylon College of Physicians Represents Sri Lanka at the 23rd European Congress of Internal Medicine (ECIM 2025)
Strengthening Global Collaboration in Internal Medicine

The Ceylon College of Physicians (CCP) proudly represented Sri Lanka at the 23rd European Congress of Internal Medicine (ECIM 2025), held from 5–8 March 2025 at the Firenze Fiera Congress & Exhibition Center in Florence, Italy. Organized by the European Federation of Internal Medicine (EFIM), the congress brought together over 2,100 participants from 82 countries and featured 166 speakers addressing a broad spectrum of topics in internal medicine.

A significant milestone for the CCP was being welcomed as an official member of EFIM during the congress. This collaboration was first initiated in 2024 by then-CCP President, Dr Upul Dissanayake, laying the groundwork for ongoing international engagement. This recognition highlights the CCP's longstanding contributions to clinical medicine and education and enables closer integration with the European internal medicine community.

The CCP delegation, led by Professor Prasad Katulanda, President of the Ceylon College of Physicians, and Dr Dumitha Govindapala, represented Sri Lanka at the EFIM General Assembly on 5 March 2025. In addition to their participation in strategic discussions, members of the delegation also presented academic conference papers, contributing actively to the scientific discourse.

Looking ahead, the CCP is poised to participate in several EFIM initiatives,




including the Young Internists programme, which supports early-career physicians through mentorship,

WORKSHOP ON “ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE IN MEDICINE – OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES”

The Ceylon College of Physicians (CCP), under the visionary theme “Physician for the Future”, successfully hosted a focused workshop on “Artificial Intelligence in Medicine – Opportunities and Challenges” on April 4, 2025. The event was inaugurated by Vidya Jyothi Professor Prasad Katulanda, President of CCP. His welcome address provided a foundational understanding of AI’s transformative potential in modern clinical practice.

The workshop featured a series of insightful presentations delivered by eminent experts in their respective fields:

- Dr. M. T. D. Lakshan, Consultant ENT and Head and Neck Surgeon, elaborated on different AI platforms and their practical clinical applications.
- Dr. Lalantha Leelaratne, from Imperial College London, shared compelling real-world experiences of AI integration in diabetes management.
- Professor Vajira Dissanayake, a leading academic in anatomy and biomedical informatics, addressed the ethical considerations and potential challenges of AI in medicine.

- Professor Pandula Siribaddana, a specialist in digital health, presented on the use of AI in medical research and education.

The formal session concluded with a Consensus and Guideline Development Meeting, highlighting the importance of structured policymaking in AI adoption within healthcare.

The workshop was held in hybrid mode with live streaming, providing broad accessibility. Sponsored by ESOFIT, this event marked a significant step in aligning Sri Lankan healthcare with global technological trends, aiming to empower physicians with knowledge and tools to navigate the evolving landscape of AI in medicine.

ACHIEVING REMISSION IN TYPE 2 DIABETES: FROM A DREAM TO REALITY

Introduction

Type 2 diabetes mellitus (T2DM) has traditionally been considered as a chronic, progressive disease requiring lifelong management often with escalating doses of glucose lowering pharmacotherapy. However, recent advancements in research have demonstrated that remission from T2DM is attainable through various interventions. This article provides an evidence-based overview of current strategies aimed at achieving remission in T2DM, emphasizing findings from recent clinical trials, peer-reviewed studies, and consensus guidelines.

Defining Remission in Type 2 Diabetes

In 2021, a consensus report by the leading professional organizations including the American Diabetes Association (ADA), the Endocrine Society, the European Association for the Study of Diabetes, and Diabetes UK defined remission of T2DM as maintaining hemoglobin A1c (HbA1c) levels below 6.5% for at least three months without the use of glucose-lowering medications. This definition provides a standardized framework for evaluating therapeutic outcomes in clinical practice and research (1).

Dietary Interventions

Dietary modification is a cornerstone in achieving T2DM remission. The Diabetes Remission Clinical Trial (DiRECT) investigated the effects of a structured weight management program involving a low-calorie diet followed by structured food reintroduction and long-term support. After 12-months, nearly half of the participants achieved remission, highlighting the potential of intensive dietary interventions. Follow-up studies after 2 and 5 years of the initial cohort has revealed encouraging results with 15% and 10% mainlining in remission (2).

Long term findings from the DiRECT revealed that sustained weight loss is crucial for long-term remission. Participants who maintained significant weight loss remained in remission for up to five years, underscoring the importance of ongoing weight management in T2DM (3).

Bariatric Surgery

Metabolic surgery has emerged as a highly effective intervention for T2DM remission, particularly in individuals with higher body mass indices (BMIs). The Alliance of Randomized Trials of Medicine vs. Metabolic Surgery in Type 2 Diabetes (ARMMS-T2D) reported that three years post-surgery, 37.5% of participants achieved remission, compared to 2.6% in the medical/lifestyle intervention group. These findings suggest that surgical interventions can be a viable option for selected patients (4).

Pharmacological Interventions

Several emerging pharmacotherapies have shown promise in facilitating T2DM remission. Tirzepatide, a dual glucose-dependent insulinotropic polypeptide (GIP) and glucagon-like peptide-1 (GLP-1) receptor agonist, has demonstrated significant efficacy in reducing HbA1c levels and promoting weight loss. In clinical trials, tirzepatide led to substantial improvements in glycemic control, with some participants achieving remission (5). Similarly, semaglutide, a GLP-1 receptor agonist, has been associated with significant weight loss and improved glycemic control. The STEP 2 trial reported that participants receiving semaglutide experienced a mean

weight loss of 9.6% and significant reductions in HbA1c, indicating its potential role in achieving remission (6).

Lifestyle Modifications

Comprehensive lifestyle interventions, including dietary changes and increased physical activity, play a pivotal role in achieving and maintaining T2DM remission. A study published in the *Diabetes & Metabolism Journal* emphasized that sustained lifestyle modifications are critical for long-term remission and recommended regular monitoring of glycemic status and diabetes-related complications.

Conclusion

Contrary to the traditional approach with escalation of multiple pharmacotherapies with time, approaches aiming at achieving remission in T2DM is a realistic and attainable goal. Evidence based approaches include dietary changes with very low-calorie diets, bariatric surgery, pharmacotherapy, and comprehensive lifestyle modifications. Individualized treatment plans, developed in collaboration with healthcare providers, are essential for optimizing outcomes and sustaining remission. Ongoing research continues to refine these approaches, offering hope for improved management and potential remission of T2DM.

The meeting featured two informative sessions. The first, titled “Rickettsial Infections - The Bedside Challenge,” was delivered by Prof. Ranjan Premaratne, Senior Professor in the Department of Medicine at the Faculty of Medicine, University of Kelaniya. This interactive case discussion focused on the diagnostic complexities and clinical management of Rickettsial infections, highlighting the importance of timely recognition and intervention.

The second session addressed the “Early Detection and Management of Dengue Shock and Bleeding,” presented by Dr. Thisara Perera, Acting Consultant Physician, and Dr. Eranga Narangoda, Consultant Physician, both from the Infectious Diseases Hospital in Angoda. Their case-based discussion

emphasized practical approaches to managing severe dengue complications, a topic of high relevance in the local clinical context.

The event not only fostered valuable knowledge exchange but also contributed to participants’ continuing professional development, with CPD points awarded to those attending in person.
